Sunday 1st June 2025

This week's Sunday sermon series continues on the subject of scripture and focuses on 'the point of scripture'. Whilst I am reflecting on this matter and putting together my sermon, I am also reflecting on the significance of the Ascension of Jesus which is being celebrated today, Thursday 29th May 2025, and I realise the two are not mutually exclusive subject matters.

You see, whilst we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus during this Eastertide period, we repeat the phrase 'Christ is risen, He is risen indeed, Alleluia!' and we talk about how, up until His ascension, Christ is still walking amongst His flock and visiting His disciples, and is He still very much a present feature in their lives. However, as we know, this does not end once He has ascended into heaven, because Jesus sends down the Holy Spirit to take His place amongst us and to continue to live with us and guide us.

In addition to the Holy Spirit, God also gives us 'scripture'. Paul tells us in 2 Timothy 3:16 that "All scripture is God-breathed and useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness". So we can look upon scripture as going hand in hand with the Holy Spirit in guiding us into the right way to live our lives as followers of Jesus Christ and people of God.

Or to put it simply, as one of the prisoners where I work as chaplain said to me, the Bible (scripture) is **B**asic Instructions **B**efore **L**eaving **E**arth BIBLE. Scripture is our guide book and the Holy Spirit our guide, leading us to Christ. So why not take time each day this week to sit with and to reflect on the words God gave us, the 'instruction manual' of life. Because, thanks to Ikea, we all know what happens when we ignore the instruction manual and try to go it alone.
